Everyone Reads at Heyhouses!

We value Reading at Heyhouses and it is a vital part of all our lessons. To support the work we do in school we would like all children to read regularly at home. Regular reading, if only for a short time, makes a huge difference. Reading to your child is also shown to have a massive impact on both reading and writing development. The children are never too old for a bedtime story. Re-read some of your favourites from child hood!

By regular reading we suggest at least four times a week, which over seven days we feel is manageable. Some children will read every day once they have got going with this important skill!

This year we are holding events in school to help support you with your child's reading. We are always happy to give you tips on what works well and advice when your child is reluctant to read.

We have purchased a new phonics scheme and new reading books across school. We hope the children enjoy these new books. Please take care of them when they come to your home then all the children can benefit from them..
