
Filled with clowning, original song and beautiful shadow play, this highly physical show uses minimal language to tell a tale about taking care, discovering what's important and learning how to fly.

Costs for Parents

We are very conscious of the cost of things associated with school and want to support families whilst also ensuring we continue to provide some of the 'special' events and educational visits associated with Heyhouses.

With this in mind we are preparing information sheets for every year group with 'expected' costs this year and the term they might happen.

We hope in this way it will help families budget. As ever there will be ways to pay on Parent Pay whereby costs can be spread over a period of time.

At Heyhouses we have invested in a new English Curriculum which we spent over a year choosing to ensure it best suited our needs. Mrs Wynne, as English lead, has been busy establishing the new curriculum. We would like to take this opportunity to explain it in more detail so parents can follow it. The Website also provides further details.

Parents' Evenings will be in the last week before the half term holiday and you will be able to see the work in the children's English books.



At the beginning of term, we launched our new English Curriculum from CUSP, providing us with a whole school approach to Reading, Writing and Spelling. The curriculum is based on vast educational research, and it follows a clear pathway of progression throughout school, ensuring all children have the opportunity to develop strong Literacy skills.

CUSP curriculum places language front and centre, with a clearly defined approach to the teaching of new vocabulary. It includes a systematic approach to how knowledge is introduced, and learning is continually revisited to ensure pupils know more and remember more over time. Each lesson follows strong learning routines, freeing up precious mental capacity for understanding more demanding concepts.

CUSP Writing lessons use a broad range of supporting texts which contain examples of how the concepts that are being taught can be used effectively. Through discussion, modelling and oral rehearsing, the children will be taught the components they need to confidently create their own writing pieces. Each lesson has the following learning routine...



Revisiting prior learning and making connections with current lesson



Introduction to new vocabulary and explanation of core concept using model text



Teacher models key concept



Pupils practise together with support of the teacher



Pupils practise independently



Opportunities given to deepen understanding and sophisticate thinking.

CUSP Reading exposes pupils to a range of high-quality literature that is both broad and rich. It gives every child a mirror in which to see themselves and offers a window for children to see a world beyond their own. The content centres on key themes relevant to modern life and aims to promote discussion and provoke response. These themes include, for example, environmental sustainability, diversity, British and global heritage and exploration of important social, moral, ethical and cultural debates.

Reading lessons immerse the children in core texts from the Literature Spine, focussing on reading fluency, expanding vocabulary and thinking deeply about the texts.

CUSP Spelling builds consistency across the school and ensures that pupils acquire deep knowledge about the English spelling system. The curriculum is written cumulatively and is a balanced approach, drawing together knowledge about phonics and vocabulary and pairing this with pattern seeking and reasoning. Spelling knowledge is practiced and applied regularly during lessons. Rather than formal weekly tests which focus purely on recall, our Home Learning Tasks will now focus on applying key spelling concepts taught in lessons.

We are enthusiastically embarking on our journey with the CUSP Curriculum and look forward to nurturing skilled, confident readers and writers!

9:15 a.m. Junior classes


10:30 a.m. Year 1, 2 and Reception classes

BEFORE TAKING YOUR CHILD OUT OF SCHOOL DURING TERM TIME

We have been inundated with Leave of Absence Requests in the last ten days. Please think before you apply. Anyone with a request for 5 days or more must book an appointment with Mrs Hodgson.

In law you **must** ask for permission for your children to miss school.

Leave in term time will only be agreed where the Headteacher feels there are exceptional circumstances. Also, it is possible that leave will not be agreed when attendance already includes unauthorised absence and/or attendance is already causing concern.

You can request "leave in term time" for your child using a request form available at the School Office. Parents who take a child of compulsory school age on holiday without permission from the school may be issued with a **penalty notice**.


TO HELP YOUR CHILD DO WELL IN SCHOOL, YOU SHOULD:
