Phonics

This week's sounds are:



g- Goat - Start at his ear, around the face and down his beard.

o- Ostrich - Around the ostrich's body.

c- Curl around the camel's back.

k - Kite - Down the body, up the arm, down the leg.

Maths

Counting to 5 in sequence, counting items touching 1:1, recognising numerals 4 and 5, subitise (say how many without counting) to 5 and match numerals with a number of items to 5.

Maths Home Challenge:

Say a number between 1 and 5 and ask your child to hold up the correct number of fingers to match. Once they can do this quickly and easily, try it with numbers to 10.
