These hearts are lovely, they are filled with Christian values which will help us in life.

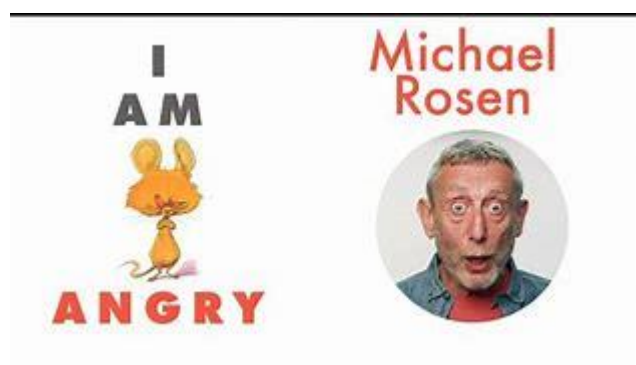
This letter tonight is making me laugh, it is full of cakes and hearts- what a lovely combination for a Monday! (Or any day of the week!)

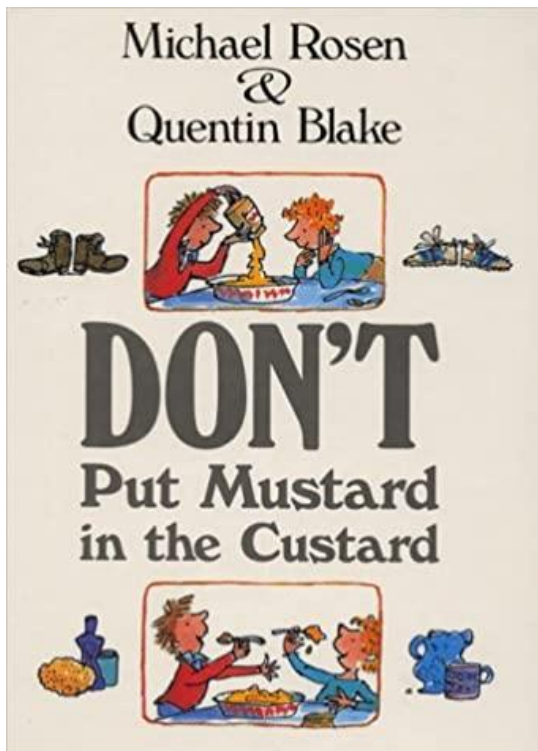
Over 400 videos of Michael Rosen reading his children's stories and poems are on the website

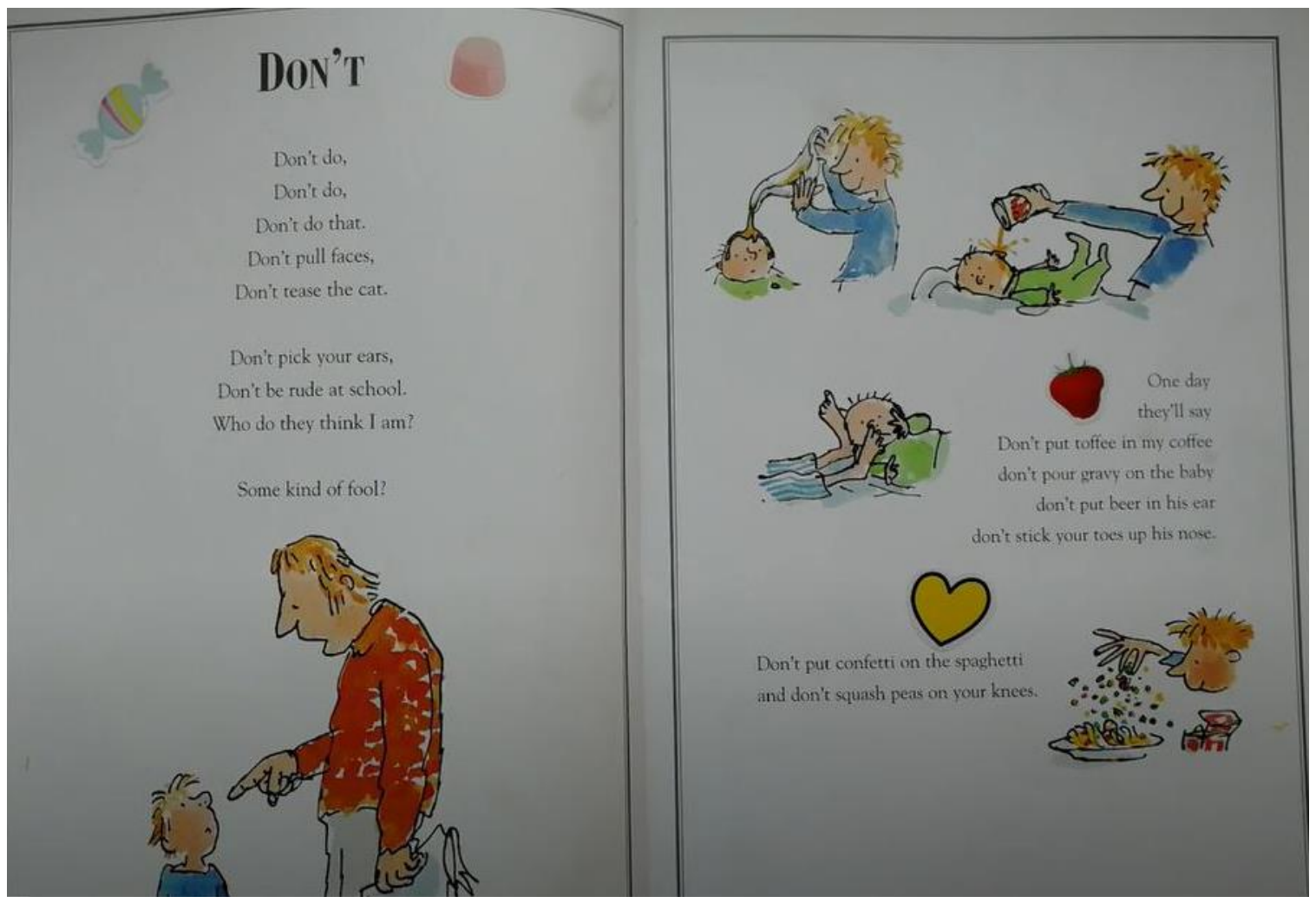

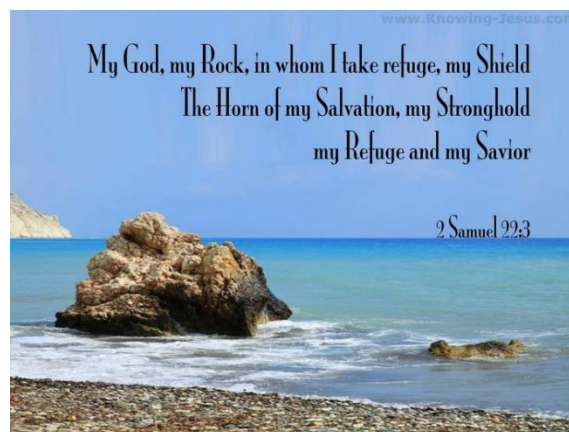
