Dear Children,

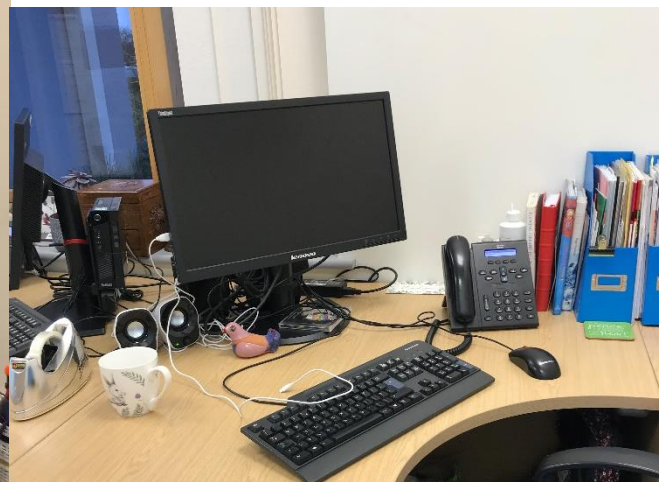


If I make this picture very small you will not realise my desk is very cluttered.

I am going to practice my Carrot cake recipe and include it very soon. Thank you for asking Heidi, it is one of my favourites too.



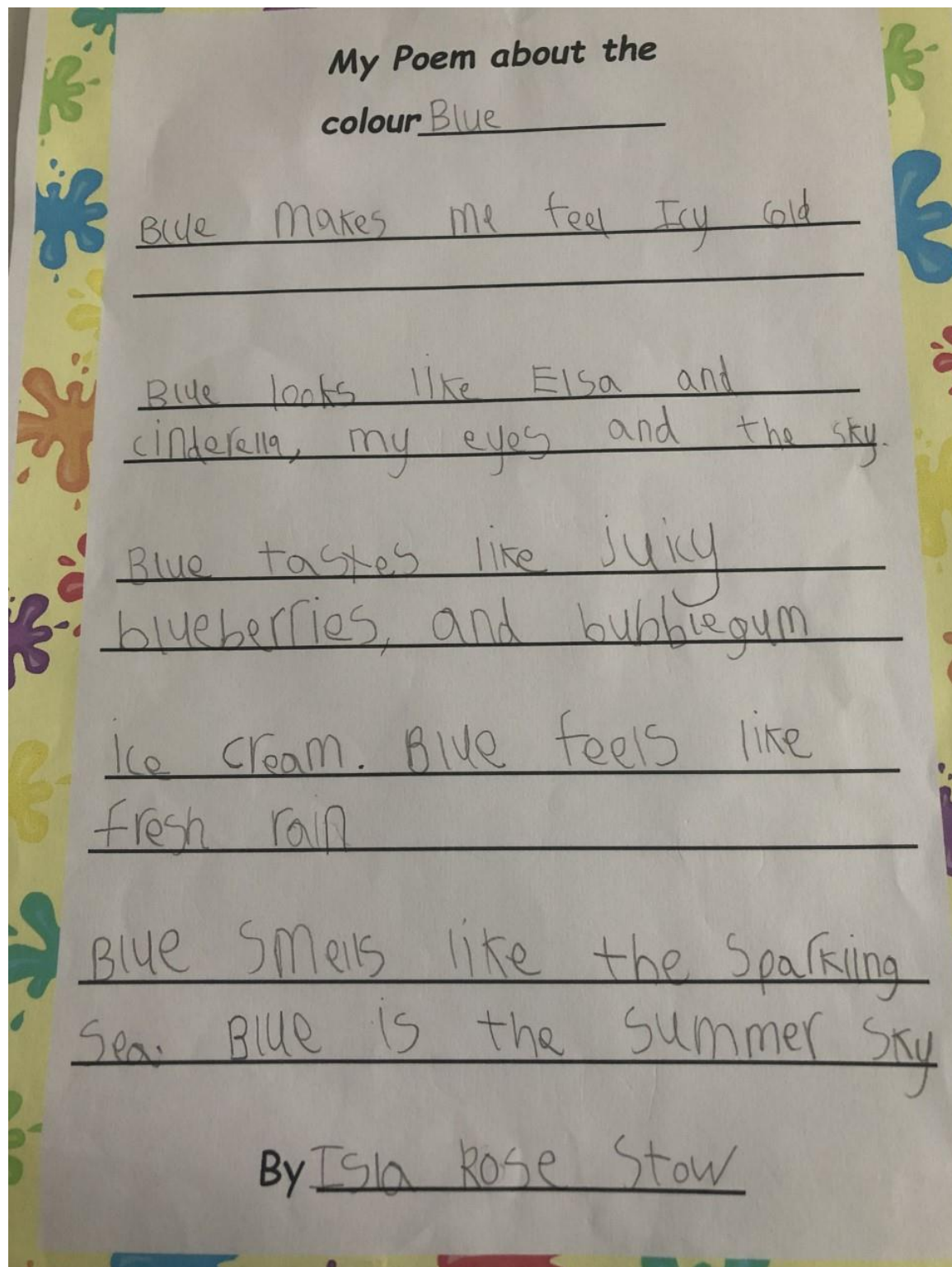
Fantastic work Heidi! Your cookies look wonderful, they are making me hungry!

I just wanted to let you know I have baked your cookies and they tasted very nice. I enjoyed baking them this afternoon after I had done my school work.

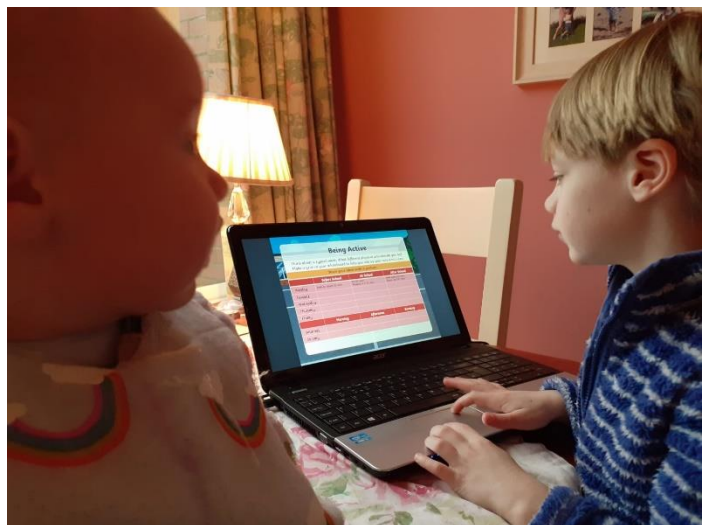
From Isaac (Spruce class)
