Being a teacher I never thought twice about creating models (and a mess, as Mr Hodgson would say!) with my children when they were young. However, I do

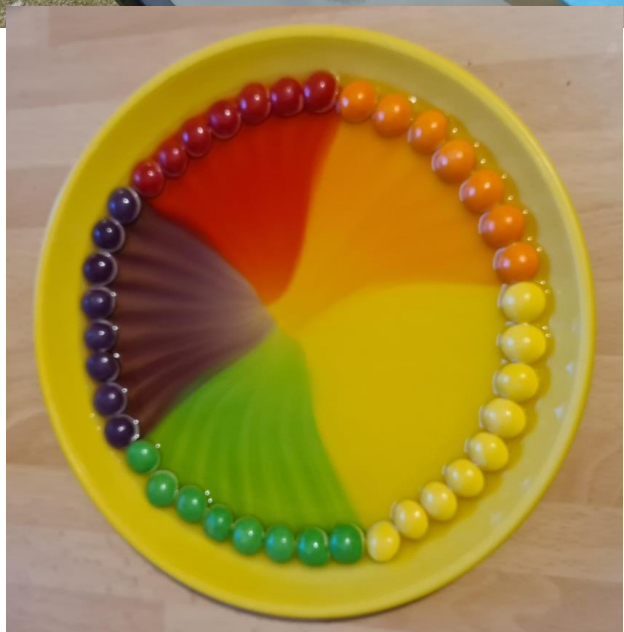

Beck in Reception sent me this lovely email:

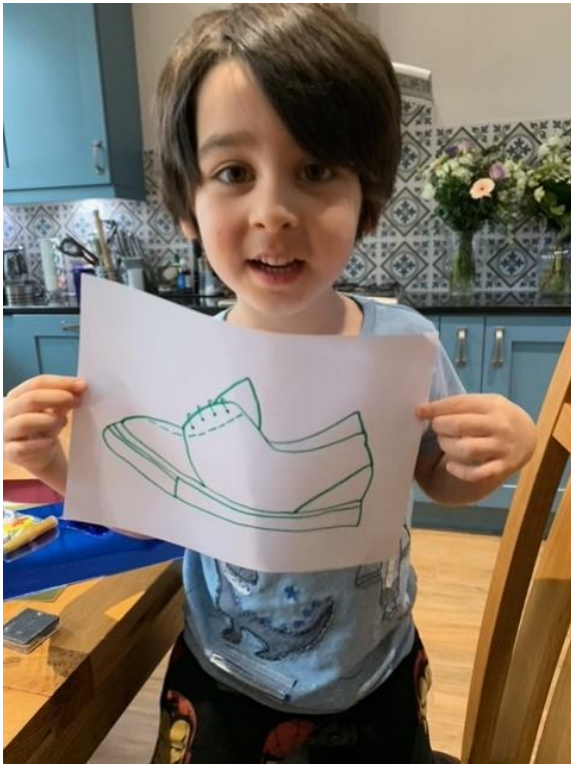
Hello!

I am glad you have enjoyed your Home Learning, Beck, and you have certainly been creative too.



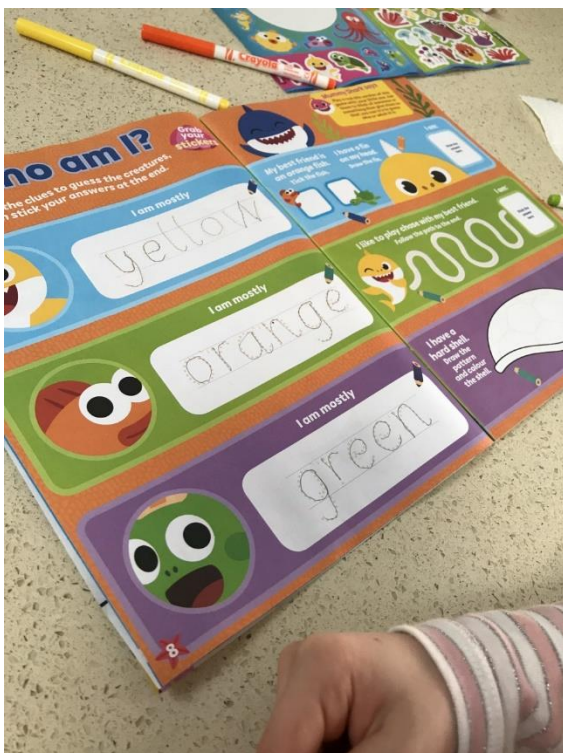

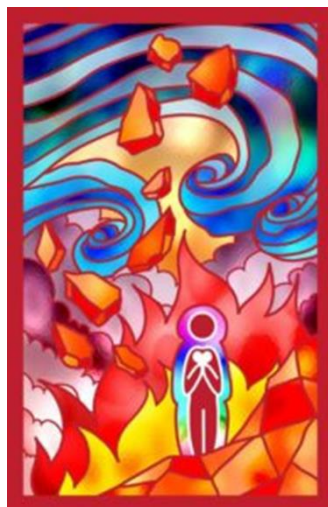
I think Heyhouses Island Songs is going to be an amazing record of the 'Music which got us through Lockdown'
