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This Week

Our focus text was 'William Bee's Wonderful World of Things That Go!' by William Bee, which is all about a boy called William who loves all kinds of vehicles. He loves trucks, trains, tractors, diggers, boats, jets and space rockets. He likes to show you how they work and what they do as we join William through the wonderful world of things that go. After reading this book we were inspired to look at how transport has changed over the years and we have focussed in on planes. We have been learning about some significant people/events from our history such as The Wright Brothers, Amelia Earhart and Alcock and Brown.

Phonics

This week we had a go at reading words starting with 3 consonants, such as strong, splash, scrub and splinter.

We continued to work on using the correct letter formation as well as basic punctuation when writing in sentences.

Maths

Focus: Developing a deep understanding of number to 10, including the composition of each number.

This has included comparing groups of objects using the language of comparison, splitting numbers into smaller parts and recombining parts to make a whole amount, and identifying 1 more/l less than a given number within 10.

We have also been learning to recognise the taking away structure of subtracting as removing a part from a whole or an amount, using Numicon to support this.
