- Self-directed study in class
- Use homework to get into good independent study habits ready for High School
- Use homework planner to organise time – please record any messages for the teacher in here and ask your child to let us know there is a message.

Behaviour

- High expectations of behaviour in Year 6
- We use the yellow and red card system and the Code of Conduct.

Weekly Timetable

- English and Maths each morning
- PE is on Wednesday and Friday
- Daily reading at home. Planners will be checked on a Friday for a minimum of two signatures
- Homework – Maths and Spellings Worksheets/ lists handed out on a Friday for return the following Friday. Homework and messages will be recorded in Homework Planners

SATs

- SATS week is w/b Monday 10th May 2027
- Children will be tested in
- Reading, GPS (grammar, punctuation and spelling); and Maths.
- There will usually be tests most mornings.

Maths SATs

- Two reasoning papers and one arithmetic paper.
- To be best prepared for the end of year, the children need to be confident in:
 - Times tables (up to 12x)
 - The four operations (+, -, x, ÷)
 - Place value

English SATs

- The grammar, punctuation and spelling test (GPS) focuses mainly on word classes and common punctuation marks.
- We will hand out a glossary of terms to help your child.
- Reading – Encourage your child to read every day and talk about the book.

Previous Papers

- There are lots of SATs practice books available to use and we will be sending home revision resources later in the spring term.
- Please do not use any past papers as we use these in school for assessment and tracking purposes. We will send these home in the spring term to show the areas your child can work on.
