The beginning of the week was spent getting ready for our zoo trip by talking about what animals we were looking forward to seeing and singing animal themed songs. The children were very excited!

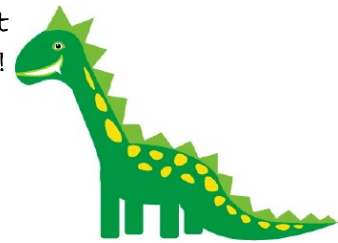
