Children are taught about: The correct names for things that are special to Hindus The ways Hindus show commitment to God Describe and understand why Hindus may show commitment to God in different ways Recall some Hindu Gods and use their correct names Make links between Brahman and how Hindus choose to live their lives Recall the names for different Hindu beliefs Describe a Hindu belief relating to life after death, explain the impact it may have on their life Compare Hindu and Christian beliefs relating to life and death and consider the different impact this has on their lives Use the correct names for things that are special to Christians Describe some of the ways Christians show commitment to God and explain whys this is important Know there are different accounts of the Christmas Story Identify the different sources of the Christmas Story Explain the meaning of Christmas to Christians	<ul> <li>Week 1, Question 1: What is the best way for a Hindu to show commitment to God?         <ul> <li>Know that Hindus are committed to God and show their commitment in different ways</li> <li>Know that Hindus have a morning prayer called the 'Gayatri Mantra'</li> <li>Know how Hindus use worship at home and at temples to show commitment to God</li> <li>Week 2, Question 2: How can Brahman be everywhere and in everything?</li> <li>Know that Brahman is in all of the Hindu Gods</li> <li>Explain what the tri-murti represent</li> <li>Know that Hindus have a personal God or Goddess whom they pray to regularly</li> <li>Know how the belief in Brahman is in everything reflects in the way Hindus treat the world</li> </ul> </li> <li>Week 3, Question 3: Do beliefs in Karma, Samsara and Moksha help Hindus lead good lives?</li> <li>Know that Hindus believe Karma may not reward them in 'this lifetime'</li> <li>Compare Samsara (reincarnation) to the Christian belief of life after death</li> <li>Understand that Moksha is spiritual freedom</li> <li>Week 4, Question 4: What is the best way for Christians to show commitment to God?</li> <li>Know Christians show their commitment to God in different ways</li> <li>Know and describe some of the different ways Christians show commitment to God e.g. prayer and communion</li> <li>Consider that some Christian ways are relevant for all e.g. 'love thy neighbour as yourself'</li> </ul>	Consider what is important to Hindus and express an understanding as to why this might be important to me if I were Hindu Offer my opinion on what might be the best way for Hindus to show their commitment to God and say why I think this Express what I think about some Hindu beliefs, showing respect to Hindus Give my own views and express understanding on the Hindu belief of Brahman Begin to question things I find interesting and puzzling about different Hindu beliefs Understand how the Hindu belief in Karma impacts their lives Express an opinion on the Hindu belief in reincarnation with some reasoning Express an opinion on the best way to show commitment to God, showing respect to the Christian faith Begin to relate the commitments that Christians show to God to commitments that I make in my own life Consider that the different accounts of The Christmas Story may cause people to ask questions Explain my own opinion of The Christmas Story and consider what Christians may think of my opinion
