#### What is SMSC?

SMSC stands for Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development. It supports pupils to develop:

- Strong personal values and character
- An understanding of right and wrong
- Respect for others
- A sense of identity and belonging
- The skills needed to thrive as members of a diverse society

SMSC is woven throughout school life and closely linked to personal development, behaviour, relationships, safeguarding and the wider curriculum.

## British Values at High Green

As part of SMSC, we actively promote the fundamental British Values:

- Democracy
- The Rule of Law
- Individual Liberty
- Mutual Respect
- Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs

These values are taught explicitly through the curriculum and lived daily through relationships, routines, behaviour expectations and pupil leadership. This reflects current expectations of Ofsted and our statutory duties.

# How Our School Values Bring SMSC & British Values to Life

> Be Respectful - Mutual Respect & Tolerance

Children learn to value others, listen carefully and respect difference. Through RE, assemblies, PSHE and daily interactions, pupils develop understanding of faiths, cultures and beliefs. Discrimination and bullying are not tolerated, and relationships are repaired using restorative approaches.

Be Kind - Empathy, Community & Democracy

We promote kindness, inclusion and pupil voice. Children learn that their views matter through school council, class discussions and leadership roles. They are taught to listen to others, show empathy and understand how democracy works in practice.

> Be Responsible - Rule of Law & Individual Liberty

Children are taught that rules exist to keep everyone safe and ensure fairness. Through consistent routines, safeguarding education and RSHE, pupils learn about rights, responsibilities and making safe, positive choices for themselves and others.

> Be Proud - Confidence, Identity & Aspirations

We help children develop confidence, resilience and pride in their achievements, identity and behaviour. Through positive recognition and high expectations, pupils are encouraged to take pride in their learning and their contribution to the school and wider community.

# Our Intent for SMSC

Our intent for SMSC is deeply connected to our vision of becoming the best version of ourselves. Through SMSC, we aim to support all children in:

- Developing strong character, values and personal principles
- Understanding right from wrong and making responsible choices
- Respecting themselves and others
