Active breaks and sporting activities:

Children across the year groups have been encouraged to take part in active breaks. Lots of new equipment has enabled staff to promote and encourage being active, this will be even further developed in the summer term. Our Year 6 active champions are also working incredibly hard with children across KS2 in providing weekly active challenges, promoting and supporting their peers to be active.

Sport and physical activity within school continues to be facilitated by sports coaches undertaking PE lessons and also after school sports activities. The use of sports coaches has been a great success across all year groups and has improved the excitement for PE and the children have learnt new skills, by experiencing different sports.

In the spring term Quidditch was well attended. The introduction of fishing and horse riding taster sessions will enable children to experience less intensive/high impact sports, in the hope that all children will have the opportunity to participate in after school activities, during the summer term.

The children have commented on the improvement in fitness and well being, whilst staff report that pupils relationships and working as a team has improved across school.

Quotes from the children about how they have experienced active breaks include:

Other initiatives across school:

Plans are in place to make improvement to the school grounds and fundraising from FOTS events will enable us to start to make some progress towards this.
