


Class News

Explorers class: This month in Explorers, we have been learning all about our senses! We went on a sound walk, smelled mystery cups to describe different scents, and explored lots of textures with our hands. We have also been observing the changes of autumn, watching our special tree and noticing how its leaves are changing colour. In maths, Reception have been exploring numbers to 5 in lots of fun ways, while Nursery have been busy sorting and matching different objects. We have really enjoyed exploring our text 'Shark in the park' and reciting the story from memory.

Discoverers class: This half term in Discoverers class, we have been enjoying reading 'The Journey Home' by Frann Preston-Gannon. The children have been learning about the animals' journey across the sea and why climate change forced them to complete this dangerous journey. We have also been learning all about the Dodo and why it became extinct. In Science, we have been finishing off our unit about the weather and observing changes in the environment i.e. trees and the animals we can and can't see and why. In Maths, we have completed our unit on 3D shapes and recapped our knowledge of faces, vertices and edges. We have also been practicing applying our knowledge of partitioning numbers to solve number problems. In History, the children loved learning about the Great Fire of London and can talk confidently about how and why the fire started in 1666! Finally, we have completed the mammoth spider sculpture which took us nearly 4 hours to assemble, sculpt and paint. The children loved this process and now we just need to find the right place to proudly display this in our classroom!

Adventurers class: This half term, Adventurers have been busy exploring a range of exciting topics! In English, the children became reporters, writing detailed news reports about the tragic events of Pompeii. In geography and science, they discovered how volcanoes are formed and discussed the pros and cons of living near one, as well as investigating different types of rocks. In maths, they have been developing their understanding of perimeter and shape, applying their knowledge to solve real-life problems. The children have also enjoyed learning how to play handball in P.E., showing great teamwork and enthusiasm on the court!

Navigators class: This week, Navigators have had lots of fun taking their learning outside. We developed our team building skills when we went worm charming on the field. One group charmed 34 worms! We made stick creatures, using wool and natural materials and then we wrote character profiles for them in English. We also made shelters using the den building equipment and re-created '*The Tempest*' outdoors in our willow dome. Why not ask the children what they enjoyed the best?

School worship

In whole school worship we have been learning all about living life 'fruitfully'... The children talked about different things that allowed them to become the best version of a fruit, for example - the best, big, red shiny apple on the tree. Many of them commented on friendship and family, which was lovely to hear and the different activities that they take part in both in and out of school. Next term we will be teaching more about the stories in the Bible that lead up to Christmas as well as continuing our work on British Values and any news items both local and nationally that we can discuss together in school.
