

What will the children be learning?

- •Reading and comprehension skills building fluency, understanding texts, and exploring different genres.
- •Writing development learning to write narratives, non-fiction, and poetry with correct grammar, punctuation, and spelling.
- •Mathematics mastery strengthening number skills, times tables, fractions, measurement, and problem-solving.
- •Science exploration investigating topics such as rocks and soil, forces and magnets, and life cycles.
- ·History and geography understanding discovering local history, world history, and geographical concepts like maps and natural features.
- Art and design expressing creativity through drawing, painting, sculpture, and design projects.
- ·Computing and digital skills using technology safely and effectively, coding basics, and digital presentations.
- •R.E exploring key concepts in Christianity and other world religions, as well as moral and ethical discussions.

PSHE and **RSE**

Y3/4 - Growing and Changing - Changes in the human body (including introduction to puberty in Year 4). Understanding basic hygiene and personal care. Respect for their own bodies and others' bodies.

Basic Reproduction Concepts - Introduction to life cycles of humans and animals.

Understanding babies come from the joining of sperm and egg (taught in a simple, factual way appropriate for the age).

	Other learning Choose 3 tasks to be completed this half term	Task: Create a small collage showing different types of rocks and soils. Children can use drawings, magazine pictures, or actual small stones and leaves from the garden.	Volcano Model/ Poster Task: Make a volcano poster or mini-model. Draw and label parts of a volcano (crater, lava, magma, ash cloud). Optional: Include an erupting lava flow in a creative way (paint, paper, playdough). Add one interesting fact about a real volcano in the world.	<u>Poster</u>	Journal Task: Make a small harvest journal page. Draw some of your favourite foods. Write a sentence or two about why you are thankful for them.	Task: Create a fact file for your ideal pet (real or imaginary). Include: Name, type, favourite food, special habits, and why it would be a great pet. Include labels, bullet points, and drawings.	Creative Challenge – Rocks / Volcano Story Task: Write a short story involving rocks or a volcano. Could be an adventure where children explore a volcano or discover a magical rock. Include illustrations alongside the story.

Reading

- Children are expected to read on a daily basis (we set a target of at least 3 times a week).
- Reading at home with your children will make a huge difference.
- It is really important that the children continue their reading journey out of school, by practising reading at home.

There are three types of reading book that your child may bring home:

- A reading practice book age appropriate/correct phonics stage.
- A sharing or free choice book your child may require support, but this book has been selected by your child as a 'reading for pleasure' choice.
- A book from the school library.

Learning and feedback

We give our children regular feedback
highlighting their achievements and talking to
them about what they can do to further
improve.

 We use 'positive pink' highlighters and 'next step' green to help the children identify feedback easily in their work.

Quizzes, tests and assessments

- Y4 Multiplication test
- •What it is: The check is a short online test that assesses your child's recall of multiplication tables
- •Format and timing: Children answer 25 questions on times tables 2–12, each shown on screen for 6 seconds, and the test usually takes about 5 minutes.
- •The government collects results to see national progress, but there's no set pass or fail.
- •Teachers use the results to identify which times tables children know well and which ones need more practice.
- Informal quizzes are built into our curriculum through KAPOW and we also use Kahoot! to assess understanding.
- At the end of each Red Rose Maths unit of learning there is an assessment to check understanding.
- Termly NFER test to support teacher judgement of attainment.

Other important information

- We will be welcoming visitors of other faiths into school to talk to the children.
- We are planning a visit to Chester Zoo in January.
- We are hoping the children will represent school in a number of sporting and extra-curriculum events throughout the year.
- We will be planning visits to All Saints Church as part of our RE curriculum.
