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| <p>At Higher Walton CE Primary School, we will prepare our pupils to play an active role within Modern Britain. Through teaching our PSHE curriculum, we equip our children with the knowledge, skills, and attitudes that they need to effectively navigate the complexities of life in the 21st Century.</p> <p>The curriculum covers key areas which will support children to make informed choices now and in the future around their health, safety, wellbeing, relationships, and financial matters and will support them in becoming confident individuals and active members of society.</p> | <p>PSHE is taught on a half-termly basis. This ensures children are able to develop depth in their knowledge and skills over the duration of each of their PSHE topics. Teachers use the Jigsaw PSHE scheme, as a starting point for the planning of their PSHE lessons.
