# Explorers:

Explorers class has been diving into their new topic on festivals, with a special focus on Diwali and Bonfire Night. So far, the children have been exploring the fascinating stories behind these celebrations, including the tale of Rama and Sita and the story of Guy Fawkes. As part of their learning, the children have been busy creating artwork inspired by both festivals using a variety of materials, such as chalk and paint. They've even used forks to create unique textures and effects in their art projects, adding a fun twist to their designs! We have also made Diya lamps from salt dough and decorated these to go in our Investigation area in the classroom.

# **Discoverers:**

This week in Discoverers we have been focussing really hard on our handwriting and making sure all our letters are clearly formed. In Maths Year 1 have focussed on finding equal and unequal groups before moving on to finding half. In Year 2 they have been focussing on collecting and interpreting data in lots of different ways. We have had lots of fun acting out the story of the three little pigs in music and thinking about which would be a loud part or a quiet part of the story.


Let's Talk: Can you sort the fruits and vegetables you have in your house? Can you find the seeds?

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#### Adventurers:

Adventurers have been exploring Antarctica this week. They have also been finding out all about materials that reflect and how light reflects. Our wonderful varmint posters are also on show in the library.

Let's Talk: Ask your child what longitude and latitude are.

#### Navigators:

This week in Navigators we have been learning how Nasa sent a robot called 'Curiosity' to Mars. We have written an explanation using formal language. In maths, we have been looking at factors and multiples and looking at multiplying and dividing numbers with more than 3 digits. In Science the children have enjoyed investigating air resistance using balloons and in History we have been looking at the Vikings, trying to answer the question '**Is it fair to describe all Vikings as Brutal invaders?'** 

#### Pathfinders:

In Pathfinders we have been solving problems using algebra, which have been quite tricky! We have read poetry and answered questions using our inference skills. We have also had fun with the 12 bar blues in music.

Let's talk: As your child if they can remember any facts about the Oseberg ship which was from the Viking period.


# This week's reminder
