Explorers

This week, Explorers have been continuing with our current Literacy text, Ning and the Night Spirits. The children have been learning about parades, we watched some real parades and then we designed our own flags. In maths, we have been learning about the number 7 and making our own collections of 7. We have also been very crafty this week, making cards and ornaments ready for Christmas.

Question: This week the children have been learning about the digraph qu. Can they tell you which letter "q" is nearly always next to?

Pathfinders

In Pathfinders this week, we have been working super hard on our Christmas performance of 'Midwife crisis...'. The children all did an amazing job making our families and our teachers very proud! We have still been working hard in lessons and have read the exciting book 'Billy and the Beast' in English. We then wrote some recipes for 'Terrible soup' which included us adding lots of disgusting things!

Discoverers

In Discoverers class, we have been practising hard in the final rehearsals for our school nativity that was a brilliant success. The children have been absolute superstars during every practice and have worked hard learning lines and singing songs. In our maths learning, we have been exploring 3D shapes, counting their edges, vertices and faces. In our English lessons we have read a poem called, 'The colour of Christmas' and had a go at writing our own version using similar features.

Let's talk: Can you remember how many edges, vertices and faces a cube has?

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Adventurers

Adventurers have been learning all about shapes and how to draw and measure them accurately using a ruler to the nearest millimetre, a tricky skill indeed! They have also been designing and writing leaflets about the mythical land of Narnia that included detailed written descriptions and a map to inform someone of what to expect if they were to visit.

Let's talk: Can you give a list of adjectives to describe the land of Narnia?

Navigators

In Navigators, we have consolidated all of our learning about Philippe Petit and his high-wire feat between the Twin Towers. We have written his full biography thinking about how the use of our language makes our writing effective for our audience. In Maths we have been tackling fractions and converting numbers – not the easiest of skills but we persevered and cracked it!

School council

The School Council have had their first meeting with Mrs. Plowman this week and they discussed many things that they think would improve our school for the better. They had a discussion around rewards and we are now in the process of setting up school 'House teams'. This will add to the rewards system that we already have in place to recognise children for their behaviour and super work. The classes had a vote and have chosen to name the houses after 'animals' that fit in with our outdoor areas around school. This was then fed back to myself and we look forward to launching the house teams after the holidays and have some house team events throughout the school year! Well done School Council ©

Behaviour

We are currently trialling a 'stepped traffic light system' when dealing with instances of unacceptable behaviour in school, in line with the school's current Behaviour Policy. As a school, we follow our rules to be, 'Ready, Respectful and Safe' and learn about the importance of 'Restore, Redraw and Repair', through reflection time and answering restorative questions (examples of these can be found in the school's Behaviour Policy on the school's website). We are now recording behaviour in school using a card system to monitor certain types of behaviour with opportunities for discussion about why the behaviour took place and how we learn and move on from it. Parents will be informed by class teachers of these recordings that are referred to as a 'White card' in school. We are trailing this system until the end of Spring term when discussions will take place with the children, staff and governors to see what is working and if there is anything that can be improved. This system allows us as a school to set the expectations for behaviour and also supports a consistent model when dealing with incidents should they arise. School is a very calm and happy place where children respect one another, the behaviour in school is good but we are currently reviewing procedures for consistency.

Attendance

In light of the school's most recent Ofsted inspection, we have reviewed and updated the school's Attendance Policy. Good attendance in school is vital for children to thrive and succeed in life and learning and we will offer our full support to those who struggle with attendance issues – keeping in contact with us is key. You will have received an 'Attendance leaflet' that has been sent home with children this afternoon, that summarises the expectation for attendance as set out

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by the government and their guidelines. The new policy has also been sent via ParentMail and will be uploaded onto the school's website. Holidays during school time cannot be authorised unless in exceptional circumstances and fines will now be issued in line with government recommendations and Local Authority guidelines.

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Weekly Reminders

Medication: Please can we remind parents that medication can only be given during school hours if this is prescribed by a doctor, dentist or nurse.
