Explorers

This week, Explorers have been focusing on our main character "Henry Finch" in our literacy text. Henry Finch gets eaten by "the beast" and has to try and get himself out of his tummy. However, he has some negative thoughts which try to stop him from thinking properly. We explored how this can happen to us sometimes, so we wrote down our favourite things that keep us feeling positive. In maths, the children have learnt how numbers can be made up of different parts and how when these parts are added together they make a whole. We did this using numbers to 5.

Let's talk! Can you ask you children to show you the sign for "add" and "equals/makes" with their arms or using a pen and paper?

Pathfinders

This week in Pathfinders, we have been really impressing Miss Higson with our sewing skills when we learnt how to do a running stich! This wasn't an easy skill to learn and the children have done so well. We

have also been learning all about the names of the planets and even learnt what the word the word 'orbit' means.

Let's talk! Can you ask you children which is the coldest planet and which is the hottest planet?



Discoverers

In Discoverers this week, we have been working really hard on our addition and subtraction of 2 and 3 digit numbers. We have also started practicing our sewing skills in preparation for creating our own 'Explorer belts' next week! The children have been really interested to learn about the coldest places on Earth and sorted animals into groups based on whether they were carnivores, herbivores or omnivores.

Let's talk! Ask your children to name 3 of the ways that a polar bear has adapted to survive in an Arctic climate.

Adventurers

Adventurers are learning about how Christmas is celebrated around the world in R.E. This week, they learnt about traditions in Brazil and worked in groups to create a 'Presepio'. This is a nativity scene, which is displayed in homes and churches throughout December.

Let's talk! Can you see how many other facts your child can remember about Christmas in Brazil? Can they remember any that are different to how Christians celebrate in the UK?

Navigators

In Navigators, over the last two weeks we have had a focus on being respectful; looking at what being respectful is, and how it would make us feel if someone was disrespectful to us. We now know that the 'Golden Rule' for respect is to treat others, as we would like to be treated, which is of course, Jesus' commandment. We have started to learn about the Vikings and where they came from. Interestingly, they never wore horned helmets! We also know that they settled in parts of Ireland, Scotland, wales and Danelaw (England).

Let's talk: where did the Vikings come from and what are the countries called collectively?

In science we have been researching what solids, liquids and gases are and how the molecules inside are different. Today we found real life examples of condensation and evaporation.

Let's talk: can you give an example of condensation and evaporation in real life?

Uniform


