#### **Class News**

Explorers: In Explorer's this week, the children have been reading the books "Bringing the Rain to Kapiti Plain" in Reception and "The Gruffalo" for Nursery children. The Nursery children have been busy making Gruffalo Crumble by putting the correct amount of each part of the Gruffalo into a bowl- purple prickles, orange eyes, terrible teeth, green warts! In Reception, children have been making their own holiday brochures for Kenya for Little Ki-Pat, one of our characters in the story. In both classes, the children enjoyed carrying out a 2D shape hunt in the classroom, we found out that we have lots of rectangles but hardly any triangles!

Let's Talk- Can you name a 2D shape with 4 sides?

Discoverers: Discoverers have been busy finishing off all their projects before the half term break. They have written two fantastic fact files about rabbits and wolves based on our book Wolves by Emily Gravett. Discoverers have been focusing on making sure they use capital letters and full stops consistently and even adding in some adjectives to make their writing more interesting. In maths they have been busy identifying 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. They have learnt lots of big words like 'vertices' and 'surfaces'. In RE they have been finishing their work on The Bible and recapping which stories are in the New and Old Testaments as well as Learning some of the names of the books in the Bible.

Let's Talk? Can you recall three facts about Rabbits or Wolves?


Adventurers: This week Adventurers have been very busy working hard getting their class assembly ready. Thank you for so many of your coming and seeing all the hard work that the class have done this half term. The children have now read and watched more of the Varmints and have been shocked at how the story has developed.

Let's Talk? Ask your child who the varmints are and what they have done.

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Navigators: This Week in Navigators we have been working on writing our own Newspaper reports using the book Rain Player. The children enjoyed writing and recording their own commentary for the match, changing the sentences from the book into present-perfect tense. In Maths, we have been working on our accuracy when measuring and drawing angle and we have learnt a new angle called a Reflex angle. Children have also really enjoyed designing and making their own waistcoat this half term, these will be finalised and sent home after the half term.

Let's Talk? How many degrees are in a reflex angle?

Pathfinders: This week, Pathfinders have really enjoyed learning about the Greek heroes in guided reading and in English writing our newspaper reports to include everything that we have learnt. In music we made loops using MusicLab Songmaker on the laptops, the children were really enthusiastic to use technology to compose. .

Let's talk? What is a musical loop?




