Class News

Explorers: Explorers class has had an action-packed few weeks leading up to Christmas, full of memorable experiences and festive cheer. Our adventure began with an exciting trip to the ice show in Blackburn, where the children enjoyed watching the performance and seeing Santa and the Grinch! Explorers also brought the magic of Christmas to life with Discoverers class by performing three Nativity plays for an eager audience, showcasing their enthusiasm for singing. To add to the festive spirit, we enjoyed a fun-filled Santa Dash, followed by a lively Christmas party and a visit to church for the annual Christingle service. Throughout all these activities, Explorers class truly shone, demonstrating excellent behaviour and making the school proud.

Let's talk: What was your favourite festive activity and why?

Discoverers: Discoverers have had a fantastic end to the autumn term. We have recapped on lots of learning in maths and have really focused on dividing and fractions in Year 2, making sure we split them into equal groups. In Year 1 we have worked hard on our subtracting skills even when the equals sign is in a different place. We finished off learning about good news in RE by performing our nativity with Explorers class. We thought about each different scene in the Nativity story, especially the role of the angels in delivering good news.

Adventurers: Adventurers have finished the Autumn term having a tea party. Thank you to everyone who supported this and made it a great celebration of our class book *'Cloud Tea Monkey'*. The children have also been reading about Mr Penguin and his adventurers finding lost treasure in the Museum. We have also been busy making and building our pull back cars. 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Navigators: This week in Navigators, children have been completing their suitcase 'boxes' that were based on our English book. They have enjoyed writing poems, recipes for a happy life as well as circles of similarities. They will be bringing these boxes home to share with you. In our computing unit this half term, we have been learning about computers of the past and this week we explored the computers of the future. They designed their own computer and learnt how to record their voices to create an advert for it.

Let's talk: What is your favourite memory from your childhood?

Pathfinders: In Pathfinders, we have enjoyed reading the book 'The Polar Express' and the poem 'T'was The Night before Christmas'. We have been working with negative numbers and solving problems using place value in maths. We made some lovely bauble Christmas cards which we hope you love and had a fun Christmas party on Wednesday. We've also had a lot of fun singing Christmas songs.

New member of staff




