#### **Class News**

**Explorers:** The Explorer class have been enjoying the warmer Spring weather and have planted seeds in our garden. Fingers crossed they soon show signs of life. We have continued to learn about animals and how we can sort and classify them into different groups. We have started to read new books in Literacy by the author Eric Carle. Reception are reading 'The Tiny Seed' and Nursery are reading 'The Very Busy Spider'. We have also been learning about the Easter story.

Let's talk: What plants are growing in your garden or on your walk to school?

**Discoverers:** In Discoverers class we have been writing sequels to 'The *Minpins*' by Roahl Dhal. We loved reading this book in class and picking out all the interesting vocabulary he uses. We worked hard on making sure our ideas were in the past tense all the way through. In science we have been looking at minibeasts and last week built a wormery as our class investigation. We are looking forward to our woodlice investigation next week.

Let's talk:- How many facts can you remember about earthworms?

**Adventurers:** This week Adventurers have been working hard doing their final piece of work linked to our book all about the Windrush generation. In science this week we did an investigation to see if all things that are metal are magnetic. The children have been to Church this week, practising for our Easter performance. We very much look forward to seeing so many of you coming to church soon.

Let's talk: What difficulties did the Windrush face when first coming to England?

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**Navigators:** In Navigators we have been looking at the circulatory system. They have learnt about the job of the heart as well as what can be found in our blood. In history we are exploring the Ancient Greeks and have begun comparing the lives of citizens in Athens and Sparta. In guided Reading we have started reading 'The Little Match Girl Strikes Back', which is a story inspired by the famous story written by Hans Christian Anderson. We have explored the jobs done by children in the Victorian Era.

Let's talk: Name 3 things found in your blood and explain what they do.

**Pathfinders:** This week Pathfinders have been working on drawing nets and solving problems in geometry. We have been revising adverbials and pronouns in SPAG and enjoying reading the final chapters of our class novel. In History, we have been finding out about the differences between Sparta and Athens.

Let's talk: Ask your child to explain what a city state means?

#### This week's reminder

On each newsletter we will now focus on a specific reminder which is having an impact on school or our children, and would ask for your support in helping with the smooth running of our school.
