Explorers

This week, our Reception children have been creating their own innovated stories of our literacy text Hairy Maclary from Donaldsons Dairy. We came up with two new characters, "Molton from Higher Walton" and "Heston from Preston" where the children worked hard to ensure that the name of the character and the town rhymed with each other. We did come up with some unusual names! Nursery children have also been learning about Hairy Maclary this week and they have been working hard on their fine motor skills by drawing a picture of the main character with shapes and continuous lines. In PSHE, the children have been learning about the life cycle of a human and we have looked closely at all the different stages and specific vocabulary like "toddler" and "teenager". The children have been also working hard on their Rainbow Challenges where they have been completing independent learning tasks during continuous provision.

Pathfinders

This week Pathfinders enjoyed their trip to the beach. They completed their geography fieldwork by looking at the uses of a coastal town. Let's talk? - How many number bonds to 20 can you remember?


Discoverers



Weekly Reminders

ParentMail forms: Please could we ask that when you receive a ParentMail form for your child this is completed in a timely manner and by the stated deadline. The reports produced by your responses form the registers for the event or trip and admin time for this task increases when chasing up those who have not responded.

Medication: Please can we remind parents that medication can only be given during school hours if this is prescribed by a doctor, dentist or nurse. Items should be handed in at the office and permission forms completed. We cannot accept paracetamol, ibuprofen etc. unless these accompany prescribed medication. As always, there are exceptions and in these circumstances please discuss this with Mrs Rourke.

Mobile phones: Mobile phones should only be brought to school by children who walk to and from school unaccompanied or where they are going to a different parent's house. All phones must be handed in at the office for locking away during the day.

Absences: All absences must be notified to school on the day. ParentMail or email (bursar@walton.lancs.sch.uk) is the quickest and easiest way to report an absence and provides a written record. We must ask that full reasons for the absence is given, particularly where this is illness related. Just stating 'not well', 'ill' or unwell' does not allow us to monitor illness absences and in particular infection control.
