Class News

Explorers: This week in Explorers, the children have been busy learning all about the Harvest festival as we celebrated this in church on Wednesday. In D&T, the children have been naming and sorting different fruits and vegetables into categories. One of our weekly Rainbow challenges has been to make a collage or a Scarecrow using pasta, beans and pulses. On Friday, we explored and tried some vegetables in their raw form and then we looked at the change in taste and texture when they were chopped and cooked in a soup.

Let's Talk? Is a tomato a fruit or vegetable?

Discoverers: This week Discoverer's have been wowing us with their pumpkin art! We have been practicing our observational skills by creating a continuous line drawing and then using the different types of lines we have been practicing to create texture. Year 1 have been working really hard on their number bonds to 10 this week and have been using their 10s frames to show the number patterns. Year 2 have been working equally as hard on their missing number problems even when they have used some very big numbers. We have all enjoyed learning about aerial photography in geography and liked finding different features on google maps.

Adventurers: This week in Adventurers we have been learning lots more about our digestive system and the different teeth that we have and what they are used for. In art we have been looking at different ways to apply paint to a surface, including dabbing, pointillism and using a palette knife. In English we have been warned by the secret gardener that the Varmints are coming!!!

Let's Talk? Ask your child who the secret gardener is and what they left for us to find?


Navigators: This week in Navigators we have enjoyed planning our Geography field trip to the village, which will take place on Monday. Children are going to be carrying out a survey of the litter in our local area. This links to what we have been learning about plastic pollution. In English we have started our new book, Rain Player. The children learnt about an Ancient Mayan game called Pok-a-Tok. In music we used a computer program to create our own electronic loops. The children enjoyed being DJs and sharing their masterpieces with their classmates.

School Council visit to County Hall

Six of our school councillors had the opportunity to visit County Hall on Monday this week along with some children from other local primary schools. The visit was organised by Barrie Yates, our local councillor, and the children found the visit very interesting. They learned all about county hall and when it was built (1700's) and were shown paintings of past councillors. The children also got to sit in the council chamber and ask and answer questions like the county councillors do. They were shown how the microphones worked, the timer system and when the microphone would be switched off if they talked too long! The topic of the questions covered subjects such as pollution and how much rubbish is affecting our county and the children also learned about the different boroughs in Lancashire. Their most interesting fact from the visit was that county hall has its own prison cells and this was used when councillors got into trouble in the chamber!!


Please note that after the October half term break it will be the turn of Year 3/4 to go swimming on a Wednesday.


Remaining Active Travel sessions for this term are as follows:-




