Class News

Explorers: This week we have enjoyed having the new Reception children visiting our classroom every afternoon. We have made lots of new friends and enjoyed learning some new games. In Literacy, we have started new books: 'And Tango Makes Three' in Reception and 'The Train Ride' in Nursery. In Maths, we have learned about patterning, time and capacity. In Phonics, Reception are busy revising all the sounds they have learned so far and writing words containing digraphs such as: ur, or, and ar. They are doing amazingly well.

Let's talk: What have you got better at this year? What are you looking forwards to learning in your next class?

Discoverers: Discoverers class have been busy investigating recycled products in science. We tested different materials and have chosen the strongest and most eco-friendly materials to be make flowerpots out of. In English we have started our new text *'last stop on market street'*. We were very good at listing different modes of transport and thought about the sights, smells, sounds and textures on them. We also worked hard in DT where we had to create a chair out of paper that was strong, stable and stiff enough to hold a teddy. Not all of them worked but that helped us to create our evaluations!

Adventurers: Adventurers class have embarked on a new class read, 'How to Train Your Dragon'. They have been introduced to the main characters and have enjoyed designing their own dragons. In Computing, they researched how dragons could be trained and shared key information with the class. Meanwhile, their rounders skills have shown great improvement, especially in fielding, with several impressive catches resulting in players being caught out.

Navigators: This week in Navigators, excitement has been building as we prepare for next week's production. The children have been busy learning their lines and fine-tuning their acting skills—it's all coming together brilliantly! In history, we've continued our exploration of the transatlantic slave trade, focusing on Lancashire's involvement and life on the plantations. In science, we investigated how plants use forces in their growth and survival. Meanwhile, in computing, the children have started creating their own animations—an exciting new challenge!

Pathfinders: Last week, Pathfinders have been learning about the Transatlantic Triangle and how enslaved people were transported from Africa to America. We looked at artefacts that gave us clues about the harsh treatment they received. We have been working hard on our production of '*The Pirates of the Curry Bean*' and getting very excited about the performances next week.
