Tudor Monarchs				
Henry VII	The first Tudor king.			
Henry VIII	He became king at 17. H married six times in the hope of getting a male heir.			
Edward VI	Son of Henry VIII. He reigned for only 6 years after becoming king at the age of 9.			
Lady Jane Grey	Jane was queen for only 9 days after Edward VI died.			
Mary I	Henry VIII's daughter. She was nicknamed Bloody Mary as she burned at the stake so many people who didn't agree with her changes.			
Elizabeth I	Henry VIII's daughter. She reigned for 45 year, leading the English navy to defeat the Spanish Armada. She was the last Tudor monarch.

Where were the Tudors originally from?

The Tudors were originally from Wales. The Tudors were a Welsh-English family that ruled England and Wales from 1485 to 1603. Henry VIII lived in London.



Tudor Purse

In Tudor England, purses or pouches were carried by both men and women. Men's bags were made of canvas or leather, and women carried simple or elaborate fabric bags. The bags of wealthy women were made of silk and velvet and highlyembellished. Ordinary women carried bags of wool or linen.
