



ESSENTIAL TUDORS VOCABULARY	
Catholic	A form of Christianity under the control of the Pope.
Protestant	A Christian who does not follow the Catholic Church.
divorce	The end of a marriage by law.
County	A term used to refer to different areas across England usually consisting of various towns and villages
region	An area of land with common features, whether natural, like mountains or climate, or man-made, like language or government.
settlement	A place where people live and sometimes work, varying in size from small hamlets to large cities.
Portrait	An artwork or image, such as a painting, photo, or drawing, that focuses on a person or group of people to show who they are and something about their personality, story, or importance.
Backstitch	A strong sewing stitch made by starting the next stitch at the middle or beginning of the previous.

What impact did Henry VIII have on Britain?

Tudor Monarchs	
Henry VII	The first Tudor king.
Henry VIII	He became king at 17. H married six times in the hope of getting a male heir.
Edward VI	Son of Henry VIII. He reigned for only 6 years after becoming king at the age of 9.
Lady Jane Grey	Jane was queen for only 9 days after Edward VI died.
Mary I	Henry VIII's daughter. She was nicknamed Bloody Mary as she burned at the stake so many people who didn't agree with her changes.
Elizabeth I	Henry VIII's daughter. She reigned for 45 year, leading the English navy to defeat the Spanish Armada. She was the last Tudor monarch.

The Tudors were originally from Wales. The Tudors were a Welsh-English family that ruled England and Wales from 1485 to 1603. Henry VIII lived in London.

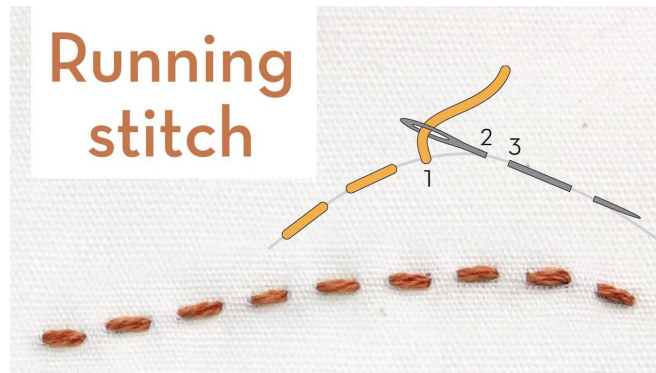


Tudor Purse

In Tudor England, purses or pouches were carried by both men and women. Men's bags were made of canvas or leather, and women carried simple or elaborate fabric bags. The bags of wealthy women were made of silk and velvet and highly-embellished. Ordinary women carried bags of wool or linen.
