Stones and Bones – What caused the change from hunter gatherer to settled farmer?

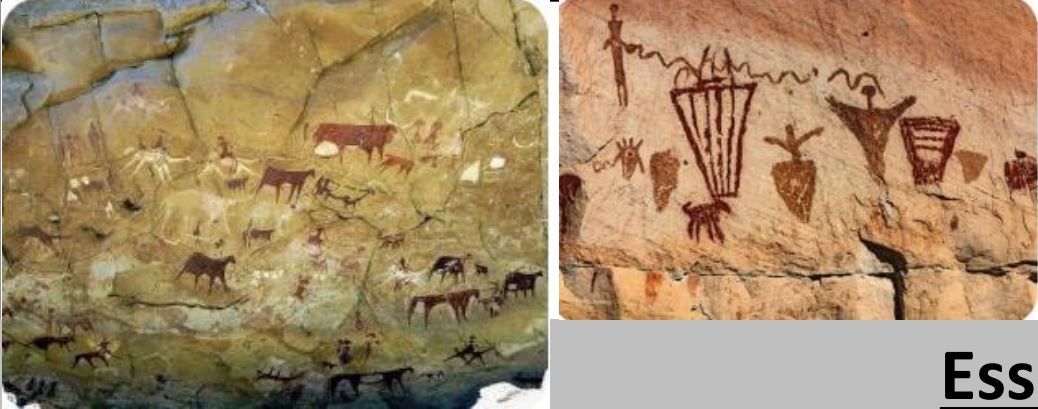
History – The Stone Age

Name the three periods of the Stone Age:
Old Stone Age (Paleolithic), Middle Stone Age (Mesolithic), and New Stone Age (Neolithic).

How long did the Stone Age last?
About 2.5 million years.

How did the Stone Age get its name?
Early humans made most of their tools and weapons out of stone.

What did Stone Age people do?
They hunted wild animals, fished, and gathered wild plants for food, shelter, and tools.



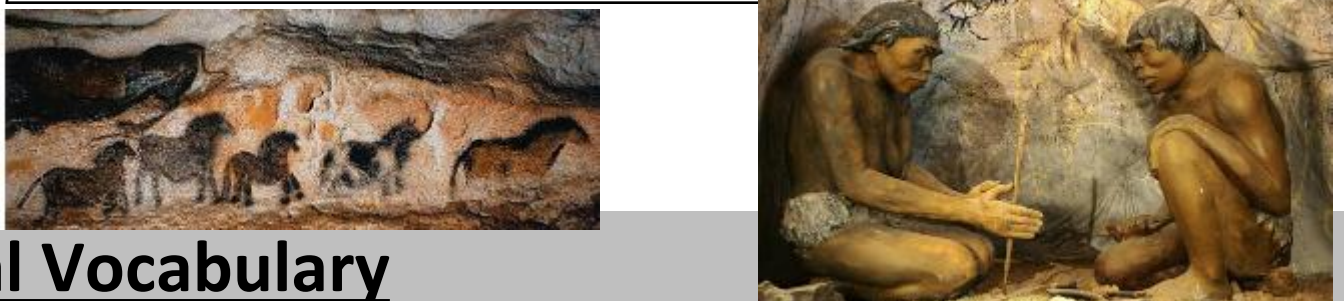
Art – Printing

What tools did cavemen use to produce cave art?
Stones, sharp flint tools, hollow bones, reeds, shells, sticks, animal hair, and their own fingers.

What are the Lascaux Caves?
Famous caves in France containing impressive paintings made by Stone Age people thousands of years ago.

What is the Lion Man?
A 40,000-year-old statue carved from ivory with a human body and a lion's head.

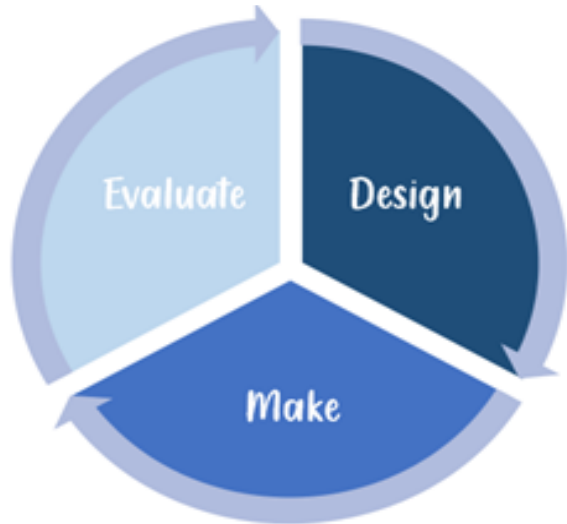
What art did Stone Age people create?
They painted on cave walls, carved rock engravings, and made small statues
