

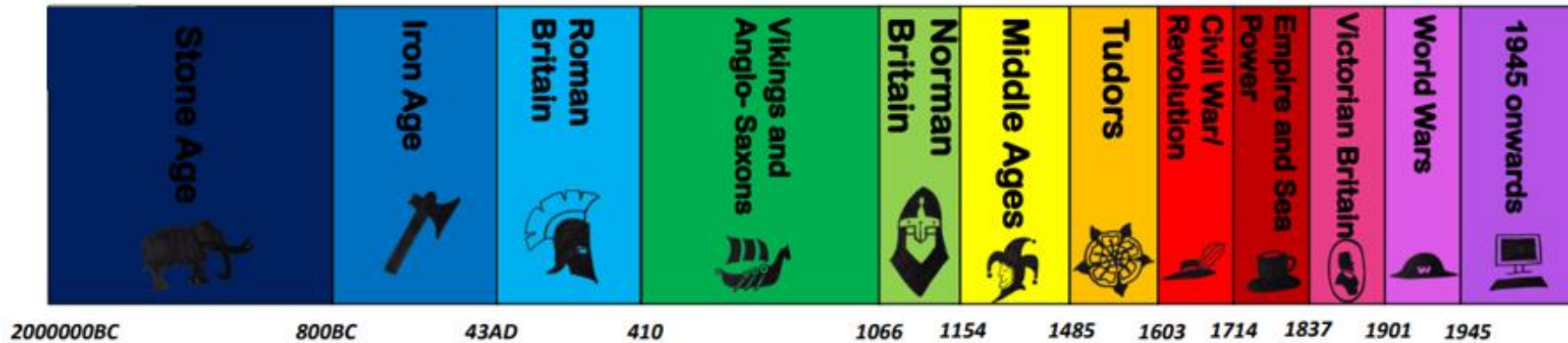

The Incas
(1400- 1500AD)

The Incas were a great civilization between 1400 and 1533. They built the largest empire of the native South American people. In 1400, the Incas took over a neighbor tribe, forcing them to become Incas. Then, they continued to take over more and more tribes to the north and south. As the Inca Empire took more tribes and land, they forced the people to work for them.

Rainforest Locations

Tropical rainforests are located near to the equator between the tropic of Cancer and the topic of Capricorn. They can be found in every continent except Antarctica.

ESSENTIAL RAINFORESTS / INCAS VOCABULARY

Tribe	A tribe is a group of people who share the same language, culture and history.
Civilization	A civilization is a large group of people who share certain advanced ways of living and working.
Slaves	People owning other people.
Climate	The average weather conditions over a long period of time
Deforestation	The cutting down and clearing of forests.
Equator	A 'line' around the earth dividing it into northern and southern hemispheres.
Post impressionism	Impressionism is a style of painting that developed in France during the late 1800s.
Utensils	A hand-held tool or object used for practical tasks, especially for cooking and eating.

Causes of Deforestation

- Commercial farming- selling crops for a profit.
- Logging- cutting down trees for wood.
- Population- land being cleared for houses.
- Roads- farmers, loggers and miners need access so build roads.
- Mineral extraction- removal of minerals like gold from the earth.
