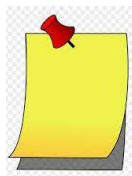

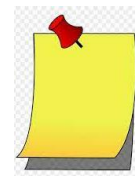

- Covid cases have slowly begun to rise again in our area so can I please remind parents who are collecting or dropping off to observe social distancing measures and wear a mask please.

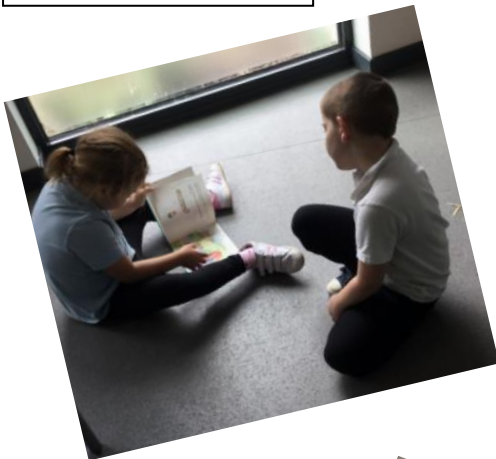
Online Safety Tip of the Week



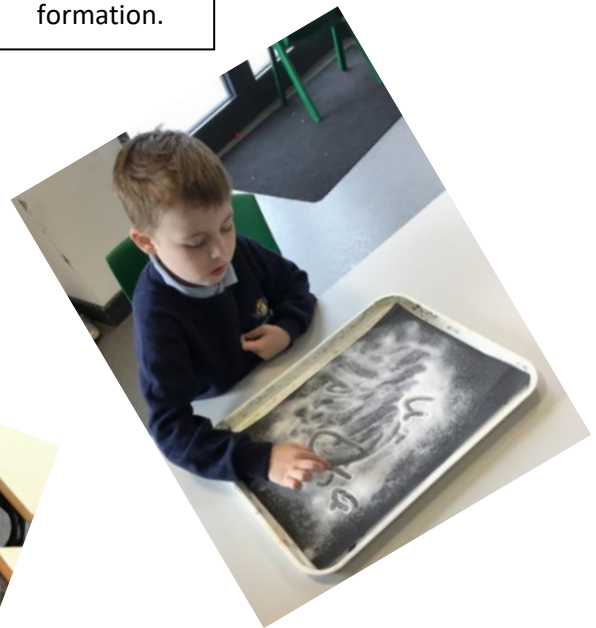

Children should be aware that not all information found online is correct, accurate or relevant. Show your child how to check information they find by comparing it to alternative sources on the same topic. Show them trusted sites they can use to compare information.

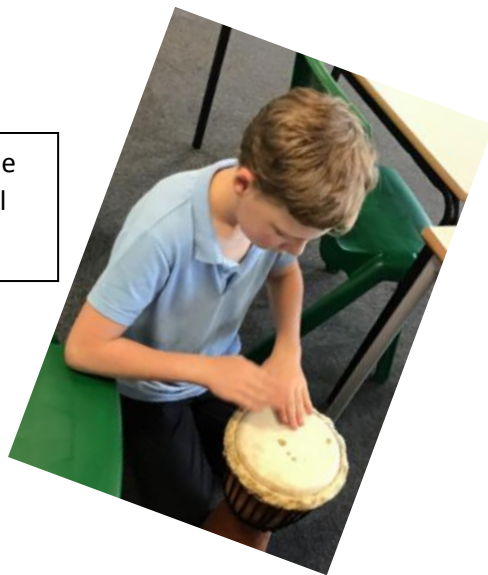
