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Dear Families,

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We are at the end of what has been more of a 'normal' week here at Highfield Littleport. We are gradually reducing some of the measures that we had put in place for Covid but we are doing this cautiously as we are aware there are still Covid cases circulating in our community.

Some parents were asking for clarification with regards to isolation periods if their child does test positive. According to government and Local Authority guidance:

 Adults and children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days. This being said there is no legal requirement to isolate.

There has now been the removal of the legal responsibility to isolate following a positive test. This being said any students who are positive and symptomatic should stay at home until they are better.

This week has seen students from S5 participating in a Panathlon based at The Hive Leisure Centre in Ely. Students joined in with lots of sports activities and demonstrated our learning value of Team Work beautifully.

On Thursday the school and students were transformed into book characters for World Book Day, celebrating the 25th Anniversary. Our students downstairs joined in with some great sensory stories within immersive environments. All students were invited to dress up and we saw some excellent costumes.
