Dear Families,

Happy New Year to all of our families. I hope you all had a lovely Christmas break?

The students have settled beautifully back into school and are all ready and eager to engage in learning. They have happily shared their stories of their Christmas break and were happy to see all of the staff back in school.

I need to share with you some news from our adjoining school Littleport and East Cambridgeshire Academy (LECA). As you may be aware, the Regional Director (RD) for the East of England issued a Termination Warning Notice to The Active Learning Trust when LECA was judged inadequate by Ofsted last year. We have now been informed that the RD wishes to transfer LECA to a different academy trust which has been assessed as having the capacity to improve the academy. The decision regarding which academy trust this will be has yet to be made. The RD's East of England Advisory Board (AB) is meeting on 26th January, where the proposed transfer of LECA will be discussed. Following this meeting we expect to know which trust LECA will be transferred to.

I am aware that this is a significant change for us as a trust and there may be a few logistical changes with regards to our day to day running at Highfield Littleport as we share a site. Please be reassured you will be kept updated throughout this process. We are absolutely dedicated to ensuring minimal disruption to pupils' education during the transition and that we will be supporting staff and students throughout this period of change. I envisage changes to provision at Highfield Littleport will have a minimal impact upon our students.

Learning in Puffins class has been taking a trip back through the decades! Maria was dressed up in 50's attire on Friday and they have been rocking out to some great 1970's tunes following a steady beat. The students enjoyed a great Queen classic 'We Will Rock You' – one of my favourites too!

Students in S3 have begun working with Lisa on our Highfield Hygge Hotspot café rotation. Each week students learn valuable preparing for adulthood, food technology and communication skills cooking for the café. They were gaining a understanding this week of transmission of bacteria and cleanliness. They all responded very well.


