Dear Families,

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Welcome to the second half term of the year. All of the students have made a great start back, lots of wow moments even in the first week.

We are still moving forward with our planning for the 50 place extension. I am pleased to share that the planning application submitted to East Cambridgeshire District Council has been accepted. We will be meeting with the contractors and Local Authority soon to establish a start date for the works. So that there is minimal disruption to morning and afternoon drop off times the plan is to construct the new turning and drop off loop first. This will then be operational and they can start building the actual extension. When we have a date for this we will of course inform you.

Before the holidays SOHLA hosted a Halloween Bingo Event at Littleport Leisure Centre. This was a huge success and it was also great to see such brilliant costumes. The event raised nearly £1000 to contribute towards accessible play equipment for our playground. We are continuing to raise money and we have partnered with My Child's Art to raise further funds. Each student completed a piece of festive artwork at school and the company have uploaded this drawing to their website. The company enables you to purchase lots of lovely gifts featuring this design. Commission from all sales will be donated to our school. Get in there early as there is an early bird discount running for 2 weeks. All families should have had a flyer with the personalised school code on it so that you can go online to view and purchase. On our training day on Monday we had some great new playground equipment installed on to the upper and lower school playgrounds. We were successful in gaining a grant from the Living Well fund and have had 2 new Active Boards installed. These have a variety of games with lights that students can interact with. The company also provided us with a reacher for students who are wheelchair users to play too. I can see that there is going to be quite a lot of competition between students and staff alike to get the best score.

Work experience onsite for some of our Key Stage 4 students also started this week. We have had two additional members of the site team join who have been a huge help to Lindsay and Spencer. One student even came equipped with his own high visibility jacket which is personalised. Now I have the whole site team wanting similar jackets!

In order to help facilitate lots more communication with our students we are trialling the use of more iPad with communication software installed. Our communication teaching assistant Angela has been working with some individuals to help them become familiar with the technology. We have seen some amazing communication moments. We are hoping to invest in lots more lpads so that we can integrate this more into every classroom and give more students access.

Before purchasing anything on a website ensure that it's safe. You can do this by checking if it has a small lock icon or "https" before the URL. The "s" in "https" stands for "secure" and the lock means it's confirmed as a safe site by your browser.

Emotion of the Week - Disgust



Try to talk to your child about disgust and how this makes them and their body feel. You can explore different words for the emotion and how to appropriately respond. Talk about how we can manage these feelings.

Mental Health Tip of the Week:
