Dear Families,

Happy New Year to all our parents and carers. It was lovely to welcome all of the students back to school this week. Most were very happy to be back and all students have settled back into the school routine very well.



We have had an agreement from the Local Authority that the costings for the extension have been agreed. We are a step closer to the final contracts and the enabling works commencing. As we begin our new term I need to remind parents about making their class funds donation. In order to support students learning and provide lots of practical and multi-sensory resources we ask for a contribution of £10 per term for each student. These funds help to support cooking, sensory activities and accessing the community. This week I have seen some great learning in classes across the school. Students in H2 have been learning about different types of technology within their ASDAN units. It was great to see them around the school identifying different types of technology.
