Dear Families,

Wow it is hard to believe we are only one week away from breaking up for Christmas. This half term has gone so fast.

Within Cambridgeshire we continue to be in a designated Enhanced Response Area for Covid. This along with the recent government changes to restrictions mean we need to maintain the measures we have already put in place. We have been one step ahead here at Highfield and already facilitated some separate groupings to manage the spread. At present cases are stabilising here at school which shows all of the measures put in place are proving to be effective. We need to continue these measures for the foreseeable future in order to try to keep everyone safe. To that end just a reminder that all Annual Reviews for the first half of the Spring term at least will be held via telephone or Teams.

This week it has been great to see some of the work within our Key Stage 2 Yellow classes. Puffins class took a walk to the post office developing excellent independent and road safety skills. Great application of social and money skills in a practical activity.







## Golden Book Stars of the Week

### Important Information



- As we are in a designated government Enhanced Response Area, please remember the need for regular hand washing and social distancing at school. Also secondary aged students who are able to are required to wear masks in corridors and communal areas at school. This applies to school transport also but we recognise that if students are exempt they are not required to wear a face covering.
- All secondary aged students will be required to have an LFT test in school at the beginning of term in January. If you have previously provided consent this will still stand.
- Can I remind everyone that we are nut free school. If students bring products in containing nuts it will be necessary to confiscate them for the health and safety of all our learners. We also have some learners with other allergies so would request your understanding if we communicate some items are not bought in. This is to ensure the safety of all concerned.
- If students are identified as close contacts we will inform you and you will be required to take your child to have a PCR test. It is important for us to identify potential cases at an early stage.
- Secondary aged students please don't forget to test twice weekly and report results to [Covid.HLA@highfieldlittleport.org](mailto:Covid.HLA@highfieldlittleport.org) as well as the government website. Thank you to those who routinely test and report, this really is making a difference to identify cases at an early stage to help prevent the spread of Covid.

## Online Safety Tip of the Week:



Talk with your child about responsible use of your smart speaker and how it can be used safely and responsibly. Explore the parental controls as there are ways that children can stay safe using these devices too.

Discuss what is okay and not okay to use their smart speaker for. Talk about time limits and expectations of where the device can and cannot be used, this could include things like the speaker helping with homework or not adding items to shopping lists using the speaker.
