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☆ ☆ Despite the challenges that Covid has bought this half term we have made it to the holiday.

Along with the Covid challenges we have also had a spate of sickness and diarrhoea. I need to remind you of the NHS policies which we are required to follow as a school:

Preventing sickness & diarrhoea:

Sickness and diarrhoea is often caused by an infection. You can reduce your risk by making sure you maintain high standards of hygiene.

For example, you should:

- <u>wash your hands</u> thoroughly with soap and warm water after going to the toilet and before eating or preparing food
- clean the toilet, including the handle and the seat, with disinfectant after each bout of diarrhoea
- avoid sharing towels, flannels, cutlery or utensils with others
- wash soiled clothing and bed linen separately from other clothes and at the highest temperature possible
- You must not return to work or school until at least 48 hours after the last episode of diarrhoea

We recognise that sometimes loose bowel movements and vomiting can be associated with some student's additional needs. If this is the case please ensure that a medical professional has provided evidence of this and it is included this within your child's EHCP. The class team will then be made aware of this. Please understand that we need to adhere to NHS advice particularly if there is a cluster of cases within a class or department.

Within daily circle time session's students in Sparrows are getting fantastic at recognising the date and month of the year. They were very careful to remind me that the month is February and not August! Learners in Eagles have been working very hard at recognising and describing 3D shapes. Brilliant work.

Swallows have been doing some great learning about different continents and countries. This week they experienced everything Chinese to link in with Chinese New Year. S2, S3 and S4 have been working extremely hard this half term on their persuasive writing skills. I have had lots of letters with requests that are trying to convince me to purchase lots of new things. Each are going to get an individual reply – I am working through each letter!


