Dear Families,

Here we are at the end of another productive week.

The next calendar year marks the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. During a school half term there is an additional Bank Holiday on 3rd June 2022 to create a four-day weekend in recognition of the first time that a British monarch has reached this milestone. As the 3rd June falls within half term, the government have advised schools to allocate a day during the year as additional holiday. At both Highfield Schools we have chosen Friday 22nd July as an additional holiday. Therefore both our schools will break up on Thursday 21st July, a day earlier than planned. We have changed the term dates on the website and calendar accordingly.

This week some of our students joined the students at LECA to mark 2 minutes silence on Armistice Day. The students conducted themselves very well and approached it with an extremely mature attitude. We are very proud of them. Students downstairs also marked the silence by taking part in some poppy themed bucket sessions. All were very respectful and learnt about why we were taking part in the activity.

Upstairs we now have a variety of clubs running which are all guided by the views of the students. We have Pokémon, Comic Books, Sing and Sign and Sports clubs. If your child would like to be involved please encourage them to speak to the class teacher so that they can take part.

In response to some parental feedback we have altered the way we feedback to parents. We will be moving our parents evening held in the Summer term to March. This is in order for teachers to feedback on progress against EHCP outcomes and next steps for students and refine them if necessary. At the end of the year there will be a report uploaded to Evidence for Learning as last year but in addition to this teachers will be feeding back generally on progress and achievements. More information on this will come closer to the date.




Golden Book Stars of the Week
