This week students received their flu vaccination. We were very impressed by how students managed this. If you were unable to arrange it for this time there will be another session at school around December time.



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This week our information is not so much related to online safety but a concerning programme that some of our students are watching streamed on Netflix. Squid Game, the South Korean show that sees hundreds of debt-ridden people compete for a cash prize in a series of survival tasks masked as playground games has been accessed by some of our students. Many of the episodes contain highly violent scenes that see contestants killed or severely injured. This is very concerning and some students have been seen re-enacting some things they have watched. I need to remind you that this show has an age 15 certificate and it is not recommended viewing for our students. Please be vigilant to what students are watching at home.
