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## Friday 18<sup>th</sup> March 2022



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It is lovely to see the lighter nights creeping back in and great to get outside more with the students now the weather is improving.

As some of you will be aware the Government requirements with regards to Covid testing are due to come to an end on April 1st. To that end today we will be issuing the last batch of Covid home testing kits to students. As a school we are no longer able to order tests via the portal unless the rules change in the coming weeks. We also anticipate changes in isolation guidance so will of course update you on the implications for this on schools as soon as we are able. This week we have also re-introduced the wearing of face coverings in corridors and communal areas for staff and students. This is in response to a slight increase of cases in school. This will be reviewed next week as we monitor the situation closely. Please try not to worry as this is purely a preventative measure.

After half term there will be some small class changes in the Yellow Pathway upper department. Tilly will be teaching Puffins Class and Andy will be teaching S2. The aim of this is to broaden the experiences of learners and staff and also to aid the transition process for all students to more formal learning. These classes already swap for some sessions to utilise subject strengths so this will act as a good transition for these learners.

Students in Swallows class have been learning a lot about The Great Fire of London. There have been lots of historical enquiry skills being applied with questions such as 'how did it spread?' and 'What started the fire?'

Students in Wrens class have been really enjoying their Jabadao sessions focussing on sensory needs and developmental movement. We have seen increased levels of engagement in this activity and it is a great way to promote health and fitness.

Puffins class have been making the most of the outdoors while applying their measuring skills. They were measuring lots of different things on the playground this week and loved applying their knowledge in a practical context.

As part of our internal monitoring and quality assurance we asked an external advisor to evaluate our approach to reading at school along with the implementation of the Read Write Inc programme. They spoke to students, staff and observed practice in lessons and concluded that there were strong, consistent approaches to reading across the school. The student group did us proud and showed off their reading skills beautifully. There was lots of joint working and application of blending skills with recognition of 'special friends' which is part of the scheme. Students have made great progress in this area and I hope you are finding the online reading resources from Oxford Owl beneficial to support at home.
