Students will need to have consent forms completed to use this equipment and is restricted to classes upstairs due to health and safety implications. All of the hard work we have invested in our reading and phonics development were shown to be paying off this week. We have introduced Read Write Inc. as a scheme and it has shown some great results. I had a lovely comment from a student passed to me this week saying 'My teacher has made me really love reading now'. Such a lovely, unprompted comment.
