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Dear Families,

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Welcome back to the summer term! The week started off looking like summer term weather but unfortunately the rain has returned.

Unfortunately I have to start our newsletter with some disappointing news. Due to budget restrictions and the lack of donations to class funds from parents and carers we are going to have to stop our daily toast time with the students as from after half term. Currently this is costing the school approximately £120 per month which we cannot sustain from our school budget. We need to use our funds to invest in staffing and resources to support our learners. This will be a great loss as this was a valuable opportunity to develop independent and life skills with our learners as well as providing those picky eaters with varied experiences. We only ask for a donation of £7.50 per term (Autumn, Spring and Summer) to help provide for this so again we are asking for these donations to be made via ParentPay. If we have sufficient donations then we will consider reinstating this.

You will see from the Class Dojo posts that there will be a school nursing clinic based at Highfield Littleport on Monday 24th April. The aim of these clinics is to give children and families the opportunity to seek advice and discuss any concerns they may have in areas such as toileting, diet, emotional health, sleep, growing up/puberty and other general health advice and support. As you may be aware there is further NEU strike action on Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May. Currently we will be open as normal but if there are any changes to provision or class closures we will inform you via Class Dojo and the website.

This week brings our residential trip to Norfolk Lakes for some students. We aim to leave school at lunch time on Wednesday and will return by the end of the day on Friday. We are looking forward to completing a range of adventurous activities and having lots of opportunities to develop social skills.

This week we were fortunate enough to have the English Touring Opera come to deliver a performance of 'Zoo' to our students upstairs. I will admit the initial reaction of the students when hearing they were going to watch opera wasn't that positive. This soon changed at the end of the performance. The students commented that it was amazing, fantastic and brilliant. It was great to be able to expose them to a great cultural, immersive and sensory experience. We are hoping that funds (including donations) will mean that we can book this for next year as it was a fantastic experience for our learners.

This week we also had a visit from the police force to fit in with the lower green pathway learning on 'Our Community'. The students were brilliantly behaved and really benefitted from the experience. Some of our older students talked to our visitors about careers in the police force and related jobs and they asked some very insightful questions.
