We are currently working with the team to support our Year 11 students with anxieties around transition and moving on. Referrals can be made via the school, please do speak to your child's class teacher if you feel that some of the topics may be of interest. We are looking at inviting the team to one of our future coffee mornings so that you can find out more.

Next week we will be hosting two Year 10 work experience students into school from our local mainstream settings. We are looking forward to sharing our excellent practice with them and helping to develop the next generation of potential teachers and teaching assistants. Also next week some of our students from Key Stage 4 will be collaborating with Highfield Ely Academy and going on a residential to Longtown on the Welsh border. Fingers crossed they have good weather for their trip. Next week we will also be welcoming a Warrant Officer from RAF Marham to speak to students about different jobs and careers within the Royal Air Force. A busy week in store!
