The enabling works have started and we now have lots of contractors and machinery on site. This week we have had a number of visitors to our school. On Monday our CEO Lynsey Holzer and some of her colleagues came to conduct a Trust behaviour review. They were extremely pleased with the positive relationships that are in place and the clarity in our systems and consequences to promote good behaviour in our learners. Thank you to the parents and carers that spoke to the team to feedback their views. It was a great result!

We have a SOHLA meeting at Littleport Leisure Centre café on Friday 7th February at 3.45pm. We hope to see lots of old and new faces coming to help support our school. On Wednesday 5th February at 1.30pm we will be holding a parent session to help develop early communication. We look forward to seeing you all.

On Tuesday we also had a visit from Ofsted. They were not inspecting the school but currently they are conducting a Local Authority Area Inspection of SEND. Our school was chosen to share our views on local authority support and how this may or may not impact provision. We were honest in our feedback and hopefully this will improve the situation at the Local Authority so that EHCP process rates and communication with them will be improved. I felt very proud to show them how great our school is and they loved speaking to some of the students.

This week some students in Year 11 went on a residential trip to Grafham Water as part of an NCS funded project. This gave our learners a valuable opportunity to develop skills in preparation for adulthood. They had a great time and were all able to develop their social opportunities as students from other special schools also attended. Huge thanks to the staff who organised the trip and gave up their own time to support the students — it is greatly appreciated as we recognise this wouldn't be possible without their support.

Students in Robins class have been improving their engagement and interaction skills beautifully this week. It was lovely to observe lots of intensive interaction and positive communication with students.
