We have Angela now in post as our Intervention Coordinator who will be covering some PPA sessions as well as leading on TEACCH and Lego Therapy interventions. Our school also welcomes Laura who is in a teaching role covering some of our management and PPA time. As our school grows, we now have a larger Leadership Team. We have Kirsty who is Department Lead for classes downstairs and Tilly who is Department Lead for upstairs reporting to Lyn our Assistant Head. I would like to urge any concerns to be initially directed to the class teacher as they are best placed to deal with any queries that may arise. Then the appropriate leadership chain can be followed if at all necessary.

A big thank you to all of the parents and carers who attended our Curriculum Information session on Thursday last week. Anyone who missed the session can find the entire curriculum developments detailed on our website. I have uploaded the presentation and we have developed parent handbooks for each pathway should you like one for more information.

This September we have fully adopted the Evidence for Learning software to use as an evidence collection and assessment tool. Evidence of learning towards our curriculum frameworks and progress towards Education Health Care Plan outcomes are recorded within this software. In order to fully maximise the learning partnership between home and school we will be opening up this software for parents to view and contribute to at home. The software enables you to view progress at school on a real time basis. Parents and carers will also be able to upload and share evidence from home with us to contribute towards your child's progress. We see our work as a partnership between home and school and are excited to be able to offer this facility. We will be trialling this with a few parents over the coming weeks and aiming to have all parents connected by October half term. In order to facilitate this please ensure you have completed your data collection sheets with your email address and returned them to the school office. When we are ready to 'go live' with all parents we will circulate a step-by-step guide as to how to get started and get everyone connected. I will send out a separate information letter at a later date with more information about these exciting developments.

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We are now fortunate enough to have secured some Music Therapists to work at Highfield Littleport. Owls class will be having a group session each week as well as other individual students on a referral basis. Classes are lucky to benefit from cooking, sensory activities and creative curriculum opportunities. In order for us to continue this we ask for a £5 donation per term, per child. Could I also remind you to regularly check your child's hair for head lice and treat if necessary as we are getting quite a few confirmed cases? In addition, attendance at school is extremely important to facilitate good progress and wellbeing. We would encourage you to support us with this and in helping us to maintain our baseline target of 92% attendance as a school. Attendance levels are continually monitored and any persistent absences mean that the school and local authority will take action.
