	<ul> <li>Highfield Littleport Academy</li> <li>KJa had shared her Business Manager Report for HLA together with internal audit reports for Safer Recruitment and website.</li> <li>Finance</li> <li>The anticipated carry forward for year end is significantly greater than originally assessed and is now predicted to be in the region of £500k.</li> </ul>		





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	<ul> <li>Premises</li> <li>The report on the hydro-pool concluded that whilst there may have been a design fault, this would be difficult to pursue legally and they have advised buying and fitting the required part.</li> <li>The issue with the gates has now been resolved and the lift from the reception area is to be repaired.</li> <li>H&amp;S – Covid-19</li> <li>Lateral Flow Testing is in place manned by volunteer staff. There have been 3 positive cases identified.</li> <li>Catering: the kitchen is closed and staff are furloughed. Currently HLA is paying the remaining 20% of these salaries although as lockdown continues it is likely that money will be lost.</li> <li>Vouchers are being sent to those eligible for free school meals.</li> <li>Internal Audit</li> <li>The Trust's internal auditor has completed a Safer Recruitment audit and school website audit. A few issues that were raised have now been resolved.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Pippa Edwards' Business Manager Report, H&amp;S Report and Period 3 accounts had been sent to governors.</li> <li>Governors had the following questions:</li> <li>Q What is sponsor income?</li> <li>A This is the central charge to the Trust</li> <li>Q The H&amp;S report says that the unplanned fire drill didn't go well. How much confidence do you therefore have in the event of a fire?</li> <li>A There was a group in the pool at the time which made the drill challenging. There was also an issue with the walkie talkies. This exercise was very useful for identifying these issues in order to ensure smoother evacuation in the event of a real situation. There is an invacuation drill planned this term.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Reports from both Heads of School had been circulated.</li> <li>Highfield Ely Academy (AD)</li> <li>Ethnicity data had been added as requested at the previous LGB meeting.</li> <li>Q Are you sure your recruitment processes are open and fair?</li> <li>A We ensure that our applications have no identifying information so these details are not known for those that are short listed.</li> <li>AD highlighted a few areas from the report and added the following information: <ul> <li>VM will be attending the next DP meeting as safeguarding link governor for HEA.</li> <li>SB added that the schools are assessing and quality assuring the curriculum offer, Teaching &amp; Learning and progress. Any gaps identified will be addressed.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Q How is staff wellbeing at the moment, has it become any worse? A People are reassured by the stringent measures in place this term. Where there are issues this is around personal problems and we are signposting to EAP and working with them individually to support them as much as possible.</li> </ul>
