## Rationale

At Hillsborough Primary School we believe that a school uniform fosters a sense of identity, belonging and pride. At Hillsborough Primary School our uniform sets a high standard of appearance for all, whilst clothing pupils in practical, cost-effective school wear.

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## Aims

At Hillsborough we **Believe** in setting high standards for the presentation of children at school to promote confidence in and accountability to each other. Wearing uniform develops a sense of community and **Belonging** to our school and is a visible representation of this in the local community. We also know this has a positive impact on behaviour and attitudes in school, supported by parents at home, and ensures children **Become** accepting of rules and regulations in every day life.

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## Implementation of Policy

At Hillsborough Primary School we believe that a school uniform ensures that:

- Everybody is practical and looks smart.
- Children feel equal to others in terms of appearance.
- There is no distraction in class and it is regarded suitable clothing for school.
- Children can be identified when taking part in out of school educational activities and visits.

At Hillsborough Primary School we try to encourage our children to take responsibility for their own appearance, to look clean, smart and tidy at all times. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure their child is properly attired for school. Members of the school staff have responsibility for promoting the school's uniform policy by reminding children about the rules relating to appropriate dress.

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## **At Hillsborough Primary School the school uniform consists of:**

- Royal blue polo shirt
- Navy jumper/cardigan/fleece
- Black/dark grey trousers or skirts/dresses or blue checked dresses
- Plain black shoes

## **P.E Kit:**

- White T-shirt
- Black or navy shorts and/or jogging bottoms
- School jumper for the colder months
- Pumps or trainers

We do not expect that all jumpers or cardigans need to be purchased through our uniform provider. Plain navy jumpers or cardigans purchased from the supermarkets are acceptable. Our uniform provider is Logo Leisurewear. You can purchase branded goods from [here](#).

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## **School Uniform Rules at Hillsborough Primary School**

- No jewellery, except small, plain studs for pierced ears and wrist watches – both of which must be removed for P.E and swimming.
  - Skirt length modest – no shorter than just above the knee.
  - No high-heeled shoes over 3cm.
  - No fashion items, e.g. boot-leg trousers, mini-skirts or designer sportswear, or accessories such as false nails and lashes.
  - Socks and tights should be plain coloured, no patterns or cartoons.
  - All clothing, including coats and shoes must be labelled with pupil's name.
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## Jewellery

- At Hillsborough Primary School children should only wear one pair of small, plain stud earrings. These should not be worn on P.E. or swimming days.
- If children come to school wearing earrings on P.E days they will have to take the earrings out themselves or cover them over with a plaster or Micropore tape which they have brought from home. If they come to school wearing them on swimming days, unless they can take them out the leisure centre will not allow them to participate in the lesson.
- Chains or bracelets should not be worn to school.
- Children in Key Stage 2 can wear a watch.
- Teachers do not take responsibility for looking after jewellery.

We anticipate all parents will fully support the uniform policy. Each class will have uniform checks and any child who is not fully adhering to the policy will be given a school jumper to wear during the school day and this will be returned to the office before they go home. A reminder slip will be given to the child to let parents know they have borrowed uniform that day. If this continues, a member of the senior leadership team will contact the parents to offer help or support where uniform is concerned. It is an expectation that all children wear the uniform as referenced in the Home School Agreement.
