This week we are moving onto a new text for our Literacy lessons— *Home is Where the Birds Sing'* by Cynthia Rylant. It is a beautiful story about what makes a home feel like a home. We will be talking about who lives in our house and what our houses look like. Are they the same or different?

The children really enjoyed their welly walk on Thursday. They found lots of leaves and noticed the colours and patterns.

We will be talking about why some leaves change colour and fall on the floor in the coming weeks.

<u>Games</u>

Many of the children this week have enjoyed playing our game, **Shopping List** from Orchard Toys. Players take it in turns to choose a card. If the shopping item is on their shopping list, they get to put it in their trolley. If not, the player puts it back and then it is the turn of the next person.

Playing games similar to this is a brilliant opportunity to practise observational skills, talking turns and waiting. Start with simple lotto games like Shopping List with two people playing (so their time to wait isn't too long) and then you can increase the amount of players in time (up to 4 people is perfect). Keep an eye out for these games in Lidl or Aldi, they are often on sale at a discounted price.
