Writing

In our writing sessions we will be writing autobiographies based on our book Rooftoppers, scientific explanatory texts, and Shakespearean Sonnets.

Throughout, children will be developing their punctuation and grammar skills as well as receiving daily spelling sessions.

Reading

History

In History, we will be learning about the most influential British Monarchs in History. We will explore the heroism of William the Conqueror at the battle of Hastings and experience the wrath of Henry the VIII.

Science

Throughout the term, pupils will investigate the way in which living things are classified through the study of Carl Linnaeus' work. We will also explore the properties of light.

Our learning this term focuses on the effects of drug and alcohol use, and human rights.

DT

Our units in design this term include:

- Mechanisms How do pulleys and gears let you see the world?

RE

In RE we will be learning about Islam. We will also be learning about the importance of Christmas to Christians.

Maths



In Mathematics this term, we will be learning how to compare and order numbers up to 10,000,000 and exploring negative numbers. We will also be solving complex problems involving the four operations and exploring properties of number including prime numbers and cubed numbers.

Geography

In geography we will be completing a comparative study of three different areas in the world: The Lake District, The Tatra mountains in Poland and the Caribbean. We will explore the climate, physical features and wildlife.

Art

Pupils will be developing their skills in drawing by looking at the influential artist Frida Kahlo. We will then move onto painting and collage skills.
