	<ul> <li>Sing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs.</li> <li>Perform songs, rhymes and poems and other stories with others and (when appropriate ) try to move in time with the music</li> </ul>	At Hillside, there is a weekly music session lead by the Music Lead in Nursery. The Music Lead covers a Reception class fortnightly. The topics for the terms in Nursery music are: 1. Introductions 2. Nursery Rhymes 3. Traditional Songs 4. World Music 5. The Farmer's Din 6. Bitten by the Music Bug In these sessions children sing a wide range of songs and play a range of percussion instruments. They are introduced to tuned instruments through teacher demonstrations.
