On the 6th of February 2024, Hillside Primary School took part in Safer Internet Day. Safer Internet Day is celebrated globally every year to promote the safe and positive use of digital technology for children and young people and inspire a national conversation. The theme for 2024 was 'Inspiring change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online'.

The internet has an amazing range of information and opportunities online, but how can we help support children and young people separate fact from fiction? From gaming and chat, to streaming and video, young people are shaping the interactive entertainment spaces they are a part of. 
