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

Why reading support at home is important?

Reading at home with your children helps them to strengthen their language, vocabulary, and comprehension skills.



Those Who Read Succeed! Please talk to your child about the book they are currently reading and foster a love of reading culture at home. Why read 20 minutes at home? Child C Reads: Child A Reads: Child B Reads: 20 minutes per day 5 minutes per day 1 minute per day 3,600 minutes per school year 900 minutes per school year 180 minutes per school year






















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Governor update
